Understanding and Securing the Wireless Network (in English)

Date: October 26, 2010 (Day 2 of IT Security Training Week)

Introduction

This one day workshop starts with a quick review of key terms and technologies to ensure an understanding of what is involved in today's wireless network. It provides the attendee with not only a detailed understanding, but with techniques and tools to use for verifying the security and controls within their Wifi environment, including valuable demonstrations. Attendees will learn key concepts and how to ensure the security, audit and control of this environment.

Learning Objectives

- recognize the key elements of a wireless network;
- describe how each part of the wireless network works;
